In accordance with DoD Conference Guidance, dated June 26, 2016, and the current Air Force Supplement to DoD Conference Guidance 4.0, dated September 7, 2017, I have reviewed your request to host the 2024 CSS "Inspire" event currently scheduled for May 14-16, 2024 at Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph Taj Mahal, Fleenor Auditorium. I have determined this event meets the conference exemption criteria for formal classroom training. Specifically, this seminar is exempt in that:

- a. It is for the sole purpose of training Total Force CSS Force Support professionals on internal Department of the Air Force current and future programs affecting total force personnel and all sessions are mandatory for attendees.
- b. Over 85.5% of the event consists of classroom formal training and the remaining 14.5% consist of remarks by senior leaders and career field leadership to set the stage for the instruction to follow and to relate core concepts back to real-world applicability.
- c. The costs and facility requirements meet the minimum requirements for the seminar to be a successful event and to accommodate the anticipated 650 inperson attendees out of approximately 9,500 Total Force CSS personnel.
- d. The means of instruction will be in a classroom setting with Headquarters of the Air Force, Air Force Personnel Center, and program experts/trainers and not in a format where participants spend the day speaking with exhibitors or obtaining others' views through participation in small groups.
- e. The event allows Total Force CSS personnel to learn the programs they utilize daily, the policy behind it, future state (A1 Digital Transformation), and proper utilization of all current and future human resource systems.

While I approve this exemption, you must ensure the best use of government funds and adherence to all applicable laws and policies and their underlying spirit. Additionally, ensure only personnel with a mission-essential need to attend do so, expenses are kept to a minimum, and participation at any associated social events is limited and restrained to the greatest degree

practical to avoid the appearance of impropriety. I am also granting a waiver to the prohibition of incurring net expenses to the DoD greater than \$500,000 on a single conference in accordance with my authority as a Tier 1 conference approval official as set forth in the Assistant Deputy Chief Management Officer Memorandum, "Department of Defense Conference Guidance, Version 4.0," June 26, 2016.

SUBJECT: National Defense Transportation Association (NDTA) and U.S. Transportation Command (USTRANSCOM) 2023 Fall Meeting – Approval to Co-Sponsor Conference; Waiver of DOD Cost Ceiling of \$500,000

- 1. Since 2013, the NDTA and USTRANSCOM have co-sponsored an annual Fall Meeting, providing a forum to discuss issues, provide training, and share information relating to transportation readiness for the Department of Defense (DOD) and other U.S. Government agencies. This event provides a strategic defense transportation and logistics overview for DOD (and especially USTRANSCOM) personnel and facilitates collaboration between industry and Government to assist industry in anticipating and meeting DOD's future requirements. Fall Meeting attendance includes a combination of Government and military personnel, along with a wide cross-section of representatives from the transportation industry, academia, and interested members of the public.
- 2. Demographic participation in the Fall Meeting continues to evolve and expand across a wide logistical spectrum. The Fall Meeting physical location typically is chosen in areas convenient for the community of interest. The 2023 Fall Meeting will be held at the Rosen Shingle Creek conference center and hotel, Orlando, Florida, from 31 October thru 3 November 2023. The Fall Meeting is intended as an in-person conference. This location provides the opportunity for greater participation by multiple Combatant Commands to access logisticians and defense transportation professionals from the Military Departments, the Joint Staff, the Office of the Secretary of Defense, the Defense Logistics Agency, Combatant Commands, other U.S. Government agencies, and industry representatives in support of ongoing and future operations.
- 3. In accordance with the DOD conference policy, I approve the 2023 Fall Meeting as a DOD conference co-sponsored with the NDTA.
- a. By approving this conference, I certify the Fall Meeting enhances and furthers the mission of DOD and USTRANSCOM in carrying out its assigned Unified Command Plan missions.
- b. I determine the physical co-location of DOD personnel in a conference setting is beneficial and cost-effective, after considering alternative means of delivering the relevant information, including the usage of remote collaboration tools (e.g., teleconferencing, videoconferencing, webinars, online sharing applications) and other real-time communication methods that would mitigate the need for physical co-location of DOD personnel. While the COVID-19 pandemic caused the 2020 Fall Meeting to be held as an entirely virtual event, the 2021 and 2022 Fall Meetings were held in person and in full compliance with Government and local COVID-19 mitigation measures. The 2021 and 2022 in-person events proved to be a much more effective format, ensuring mutual collaboration, and enhancing industry's ability to support pending and unanticipated logistical issues, which would not have occurred otherwise. Therefore, I approve the 2023 Fall Meeting as an in-person conference. I direct continued monitoring of the COVID-

19 pandemic throughout the 2023 Fall Meeting planning process, and participants will comply with COVID-19 related protocols, restrictions, and approval requirements in effect at the time of the Fall Meeting.

- c. My Fall Meeting approval acknowledges the overarching DOD mission benefits and gives each Commander and supervisor throughout DOD the opportunity to determine the mission benefit for his or her organization.
- d. As a DOD co-sponsored conference, the Fall Meeting is <u>not</u> considered an "outside event" and DOD or Joint Staff policy does not limit DOD senior leader attendance.
 - e. I determine the following five Joint Ethics Regulation requirements are satisfied:
- (1) The subject matter of the 2023 Fall Meeting involves scientific, technical, and professional issues relevant to the DOD and USTRANSCOM mission sets;
- (2) The purpose of co-sponsoring the Fall Meeting is to improve DOD transportation and logistics by stimulating wider interest and inquiry into technical and professional issues and innovations; increase understanding of partners, suppliers, and customers; build relationships and trust; and provide professional development and education;
- (3) The USTRANSCOM Staff Judge Advocate, in his capacity as a Deputy Designated Agency Ethics Official (DDAEO), determined NDTA is a recognized professional organization, after giving due consideration to the regulatory prohibitions against preferential treatment for any Non-Federal Entity;
- (4) NDTA and USTRANSCOM will develop a co-sponsorship arrangement in accordance with the requirements of Joint Ethics Regulation Section 3-206.b.; and
- (5) The event is open to interested parties, and all sessions are Unclassified. No admission fee beyond what will cover the reasonable costs of sponsoring the event will be charged for attendance at the 2023 Fall Meeting.
- 4. I have reviewed the cost for this year's Fall Meeting, which is estimated at \$975,000, and pursuant to the authority delegated to me under DOD Conference Guidance Version 4.0, I approve a waiver of the \$500,000 conference ceiling.
- 5. In the event DOD or local authorities restrict travel or large in-person gatherings due COVID-19, or conditions cause the Fall Meeting to be otherwise not feasible, I approve holding the Fall Meeting as a virtual event. While experience has shown the virtual option to be less effective, it is preferable to canceling the Fall Meeting.
- 6. My staff is authorized to negotiate the required co-sponsorship agreement with NDTA and to participate in planning the 2023 Fall Meeting in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. I authorize the USTRANSCOM Chief of Staff to sign the co-sponsorship agreement on my behalf. The points of contact for this memorandum will keep me and the USTRANSCOM Staff

Judge Advocate informed of all plans and costs to ensure no prohibited conference expenses are involved and the conference circumstances do not create the appearance of Government impropriety. I may withdraw my permission at any point if I consider it necessary.
